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Agenda Summary

BACKGROUND

Rates, Fees, and Charges are reviewed and updated each year and presented to the Board of Commissioners via ordinance. The ordinance process requires two readings and if approved by the Board becomes effective no sooner than 30 days after second reading. Ordinance 01-2020 – Rates, Fees, and Charges was adopted at the May 14, 2020 regular Board meeting with an effective date of July 1, 2020. Ordinance 01-2020 superseded Ordinance 01-2019 adopted May 9, 2019.

The Rates, Fees, and Charges document has been created to consolidate CRW's fees and charges into a single document. This document is available on our website and will be updated annually.

ANALYSIS

This Ordinance includes all rates, fees, and charges for direct water sales, and miscellaneous fees and charges, except for system development charges (SDCs). It is expected that proposed revisions to SDCs will be presented at an SDC rate hearing in April 2021 and adopted via ordinance separate from this fees and charges ordinance.

Rates, fees, and charges are set to recover the costs of providing the service or activity.

Exhibit A is Ordinance 01-2021 and the Rates, Fees and Charges document with all updates

Exhibit B outlines all changes to the miscellaneous fees and charges and equipment rates that have been updated since Ordinance 01-2020 was adopted.

Ordinance 01-2021 will supersede Ordinance 01-2020.

ORDINANCE 01-2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CLACKAMAS RIVER WATER BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ESTABLISHING RATES, FEES, AND CHARGES FOR SERVICES.

WHEREAS, Clackamas River Water ("CRW") is a domestic water supply district organized under ORS Chapter 264; and

WHEREAS, the CRW Board of Commissioners is responsible for setting water rates for CRW's customers; and

WHEREAS, the CRW Board of Commissioners has determined that a rate structure that encourages water conservation through pricing is desirable; and

WHEREAS, the CRW Board of Commissioners previously adopted Ordinance 01-2020, to establish direct water service rates, fees, and other charges; and

WHEREAS, increases to bi-monthly service charges, volume and fire service charges for direct service (retail customers) were previously adopted in Ordinance 01-2020, effective on or after May 1, 2021, which will be reflected in utility bills mailed in June 2021.

WHEREAS, the CRW Board of Commissioners reviews and adopts fees and charges for certain miscellaneous activities and services to recover the costs to provide the activity or service, effective July 1 of each year unless otherwise stated; and

WHEREAS, CRW has determined that rates, fees, and charges should be amended and being fully advised,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CLACKAMAS RIVER WATER BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The rate structure for direct service (retail customers) shall be updated on an annual basis as reflected in a Rates, Fees, and Charges document approved by the CRW Board of Commissioners.

The Rates, Fees, and Charges document in effect at the time of the billing will be the basis for the assessment of all fees and charges for water usage. Other fees and charges may be added to billings as may be adopted by the CRW Board of Commissioners from time to time.

Rates will remain in effect until the provisions and requirements in ORS 264.312, for the purpose of considering an adjustment and increase in rates to be paid for the purchase of water from the District, have been

completed.

- SECTION 2. The fees and charges for certain miscellaneous activities and services shall be established in a Rates, Fees, and Charges document adopted by the CRW Board of Commissioners, to recover the costs to provide the activity or service.
- SECTION 3: The General Manager, or his designee, is authorized to waive or decrease a fee or charge based upon an unusual circumstance, event, demonstrated hardship, or public benefit. The General Manager is authorized to establish a new fee or charge, when necessary, and then communicate to the Board of Commissioners in writing to allow public comment.
- SECTION 4: All rates, fees, and charges for direct retail water rates, miscellaneous activities, and services established in the attached "Rates, Fees, and Charges" document.
- SECTION 5: Systems development charges established in Ordinance 01-2020 remain in effect until changed by future action of the CRW Board of Commissioners.
- SECTION 6: Except as provided in Section 5 of this Ordinance, Ordinance numbers 01-2020 and 02-2020 are hereby superseded and replaced upon the effective date of this Ordinance.

The effective date of this Ordinance shall be not sooner than on the 30th day following adoption after a second reading of such Ordinance as provided by law.

CLACKAMAS RIVER WATER RATES, FEES, AND CHARGES

This Rates, Fees, and Charges document consolidates all District rates, fees, and charges, adopted by Ordinance for the various services provided by the District. This document will be updated annually and will reflect all fee adjustments approved by the Commission during the year.

Fee Variance and Waiver Statement

Based upon an unusual circumstance or event, demonstrated hardship, or public benefit, the General Manager is authorized to waive or decrease a fee(s) or charge(s) in a particular matter or establish a fee not yet authorized in this document. When a new fee is established by the General Manager it may be incorporated into the Ordinance. It shall be communicated to the Commission in writing to allow opportunity for comment.

Any request for a waiver or reduction must be in writing.

Water Rates

The billing cycle for water customers in Cycle 1, 2 and 3 shall be for a two-month period billed at the end of the even months (February, April, June, August, October, and December), due and payable on the 15th of the odd months (January, March, May, July, September, and November), and delinquent on the 25th of that month.

The billing cycle for water customers in Cycle 4 (commercial & industrial accounts, North of river) shall be for a two-month period billed at the end of the odd months (January, March, May, July, September and November), due and payable on the 15th of the even months (February, April, June, August, October and December) and delinquent on the 25th of that month.

Cycle 1 and 2, in general, are residential customers North of the Clackamas River. Cycle 3 are customers South of the Clackamas River. Cycle 4, in general, are commercial or industrial customers North of the Clackamas River.

A late charge of \$5 or 5% of balances greater than \$100 will be assessed after the 25th of the month due. The late fee becomes part of the total user charge due for the water utility.

Unpaid accounts on the 6th of the following month may be subject to shut-off and will be assessed additional fees of \$50.

Deposit: A \$40 deposit may be charged for accounts on the shut off list, with an additional \$10 charged for each subsequent delinquency up to a maximum of \$300 for residential customers and up to a maximum of \$400 for commercial customers. Accounts with property in foreclosure may be charged a higher initial deposit at the District's discretion.

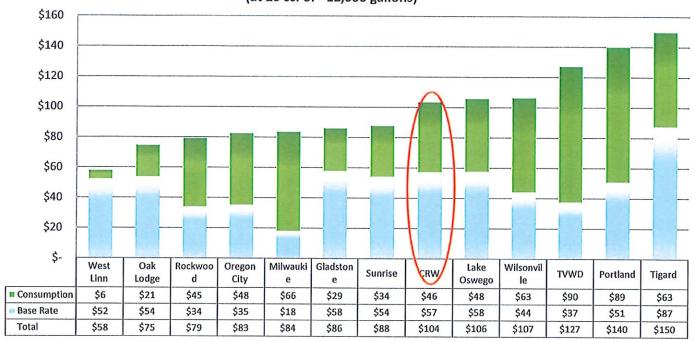

Agenda Summary

BACKGROUND

The 82nd Dr. Waterline – Phase 1 project was included in the adopted 2019-2021 Biennial CIP Budget. The project scope includes construction of approximately 2,000 lineal feet of 12-inch waterline, including interconnections, services, and other appurtenances to replace aged (1927) 10-inch cast iron waterline that has

experienced serious leaks.

ANALYSIS

Review and Evaluation of Bids:

At 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 2, 2021 formal proposals were received in response to the public advertisement for this project; four (4) proposals were

received. A bid tally is attached and included in Exhibit B.

The low bid was submitted by Trench Line Excavation Inc. Their proposal was for \$ 664,800 which is \$ 214,350 or 24% below the Engineer's estimate of \$879,150. The remaining bids vary from \$ 734,969.00 to \$ 755,935.22. Staff estimates have trended higher for several past projects reflecting observed construction trends and the use of higher contingency values. The differences

between the several contractors' bids are distributed throughout the bid items indicating competitive bidding without imbalance.

Trench Line Excavation Inc. has been in the utility contracting trade for many years and has successfully completed projects throughout Oregon including projects for the District. Staff believes their bid to be responsible, responsive, reflects the current marketplace and meets the requirements identified in the Bid Documents.

Staff reviewed information available for Trench Line Excavation Inc. from the Oregon Construction Contractors Board and found no unsatisfactory reports. Reference checks on similar projects for this contractor confirm that they are a responsible and competent firm.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Based on past work experience, bonding ability and successful completion of similar projects, staff recommends that the contract be awarded to Trench Line Excavation Inc. in the amount of \$ 664,800.

The 82nd Dr. Waterline – Phase 1 Project is a Clackamas River Water (CRW) Capital Improvement Project to replace existing waterline. This project consists of laying approximately 2,000 feet of 12-inch diameter ductile iron waterline; including

connections to existing waterlines, services and other related facilities. Construction will be along 82nd Dr. between Scottstree Way and Beaverlake Drive in Clackamas, OR.

Construction Cost: Approximately \$900,000

Benefits: This project will replace the existing 1920's era 10-inch waterline on the route. The waterline is beyond its useful service life, resulting in deteriorated pipeline causing numerous expensive leaks.

Construction Schedule and Various Impacts

Schedule:

Design: July 2020 – January 2021 Construction: February 2021 – July 2021

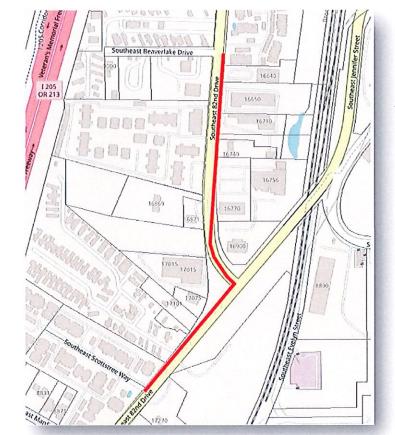
Time of Day Affected:

Impact: Construction activity will produce noise, dust and diesel equipment fumes during work hours. During construction, there will be open trenches and equipment in the area such as; large dump trucks, excavators, cutting of pavement, and trench rollers, as

excavators, cutting of pavement, and trench rollers, and compactors. Erosion control and spill prevention will be performed to protect natural resources. Roadways disturbed by the utility work will be repaved at the end of the project. Customers will be notified prior to loss of water service, which will be limited to the duration necessary to carry out the required connections.

Traffic: There will be lane restrictions during work hours. Access to local driveways will remain open but they may be impeded for short term work efforts. Emergency access will be provided at all times.

A. Management Report

1. Communications:

Monthly Report – The Monthly report will be sent out separately and posted on the CRW website.

2. Intergovernmental Relations:

Regional Water Providers Consortium (RWPC) Technical Committee — The RWPC Technical Committee met on March 3 to receive reports on RWPC activities, debrief from the winter storm impacts and discuss if and how the RWPC might share information on workforce development with the water sector.

Regional water providers shared experiences and challenges resulting from the ice storm in February. Some of the items highlighted included the importance of emergency power, coordination with partners, fuel supply, interties, having trained staff, and communications. From the discussion, it was obvious that water providers in Clackamas County took the brunt of the storm.

North Clackamas Chamber State of the County Forum - The North Clackamas Chamber of Commerce hosted the "State of the County Forum". The annual event provides an opportunity to hear from County Commissioners regarding accomplishments, priorities, and respond to questions from the audience.

The Commissioners presented information on progress on their strategic priorities (see https://www.clackamas.us/performance). The question-and-answer session focused on emergency preparedness, communication needs, transportation projects (more specifically coordination with the Oregon Department of Transportation - ODOT), and status of the courthouse project.

3. Staff Update:

Donn Bunyard Retirement – Last month I shared that Donn was preparing to retire after 37 years. Donn's official last day was February 28th. During the February Board meeting it was also mentioned that we recognized the need to work on a transition plan. To address this need and to complete some specific projects, Donn has agreed to work as a limited duration employee. This arrangement allows for Donn to be available to help with the transition and allow the District to progress on several project where Donn's insight and expertise is valued.

Maria Teresa Engelen joins CRW – Maria joined the CRW team as a Senior Finance and Accounting Specialist on March 3. Maria Teresa will be our payroll administrator in addition to other duties. We are pleased to have Maria as part of the team and look forward to her contributions to the District.

- 4. Presentation at the AWWA/PNWS Resilience Workshop: CRW's Adam Bjornstedt co-presented a discussion on the 152nd Reservoir Project with Murraysmith, at the AWWA PNWS Resilience Workshop on February 25th. The presentation provided a description of the project and a discussion of some of the site constraints and design challenges that were overcome as part of the successful project.
- 5. Ice Storm Update: During the February Work Session we provided an overview of the challenges created by the recent ice storm. We are pleased to report that power has been restored to all the CRW sites that were impacted. Although there was no significant damage to any of our facilities, there are several properties that have extensive tree damage and fence issues that will need to be addressed.

Once again, the contributions of the CRW staff who contributed to the District's response was fantastic. They cannot be thanked enough for their commitment and dedication during this challenging event. This was truly a team effort with many people playing various roles.

6. Emergency Management Report:

CRW AWIA Emergency Response Plan (ERP): The 95% version of the ERP "Basic Plan" has been received, reviewed, and returned to the consultant for final edits and formatting.

The nine Appendices to the ERP are 65% complete. Additional revisions and additions to the Appendices will be done by CRW based on final recommendations from the consultant and review and feedback from CRW staff.

The "All Hazard" Incident Action Checklists which are the final components of the ERP have been provided to CRW by the consultant and the process of review and updating to meet CRW requirements will

occur internally over the next several months. Project completion will occur prior to the June 30, 2021 EPA certification deadline.

Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan (NHMP): The next step in the emergency planning process is the development of the Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan mentioned in the January work session. The NHMP purpose is to consolidate key resilience projects identified in the Master Plan, Facilities Plan, and Risk and Resilience Assessment into a cohesive strategy for increasing our resilience to natural hazards and align with County hazard mitigation goals.

Discussions are underway with the AWIA consultant to define what the NHMP requirements are, the level of support needed for CRW to develop our own annex into the existing county plan and get review and approval by FEMA. Once final adoptions are in place the district would be eligible to apply for federal grant funding for mitigation and resilience projects.

<u>Portable Generator Grant Project:</u> The generators were scheduled to arrive last week. Due to the regional Ice and Snow event and the inclement weather across the county the delivery has been pushed back. The new delivery date is unknown currently.

<u>Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP)</u>: The EPIC team has resumed the monthly updates to the districts COOP. Last month facility information was reviewed and in March the team will be updating our vital records and resources information in the plan.

7. <u>Safety Training Update</u>: The safety training topic for January was the annual Confined Space update. February topic was Hearing Conservation, and the March training is Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

8. Looking Ahead:

- The agenda preparation meeting for the April Board meeting will be held on Thursday, March 25th at 12:30pm.
- No Work Session will be held in March
- The April 2021 Board Meeting will be held on Thursday, April 8th, at 6 pm.
- The first Budget Committee Meeting will be held on Thursday, April 22nd, at 6 pm.
