Background	As part of the District's capital planning strategy, recognition was given to risk-reduction projects and supporting studies. One area of interest, identified in both the Water System Master Plan and the Risk and Resilience Assessment, was an evaluation of CRW's remote sites (primarily pump stations) for vulnerabilities. An emergency power supply study would evaluate standby power requirements at numerous CRW facilities currently without fixed backup power supplies. The goal of such a study would be to identify ways to mitigate vulnerabilities to loss of power caused by natural hazards such as earthquake, emergency power shutdowns, and inclement weather events. The study will evaluate approximately 14 sites to develop and design appropriate backup power supply options which could include diesel, propane, or other options, based on power requirements established as part of the study. Facilities to be evaluated include offices that are identified in our Emergency Response Plan as Incident Command Posts (ICP) or Emergency Coordination Centers (ECC), water reservoirs, and pump stations without permanent onsite standby or redundant emergency power. This study would help address deficiencies noted from recent disasters (wildfires and ice storms) for these sites. Future construction of improvements recommended by such a study would be identified separately under a future project.

Analysis	CRW identified potential grant funding opportunities earlier this year through a variety of FEMA grant programs. Pre-applications were made this summer, which were approved by FEMA, for several projects including an emergency power study under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant program. The next step in this process is to submit sub- applications to FEMA (through the State) for actual consideration of funding/grant award. According to the application requirements, each project must be endorsed by the entity's governing body. In cases where CRW's budget process supports these projects, the project is considered endorsed. However, for projects not included in the formal Budget, like the Emergency Power Study, a separate endorsement is needed. The form of this support can be a resolution approved by the Board.
Staff Recommendation	Staff recommends the Board approve Resolution 03-2022 authorizing CRW to pursue grant funding for an Emergency Power Study.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CLACKAMAS RIVER WATER TO PURSUE GRANT FUNDING FOR AN EMERGENCY POWER STUDY

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is accepting applications for the Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, Clackamas River Water (CRW) desires to participate in this grant program to the greatest extent possible as a means of providing matching funds from the Hazard Mitigation Assistance Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, CRW has identified a need to study and evaluate standby power requirements at CRW facilities currently without fixed backup power supplies; and

WHEREAS, the study will evaluate CRW sites to develop and design appropriate backup power supply options; and

WHEREAS, Clackamas River Water has available local matching funds (in an amount not to exceed \$40,000) to fulfill its share of obligation related to this grant application, should the grant funds be awarded;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Clackamas River Water Board of Commissioners demonstrates its support for the submittal of a grant application to FEMA for a study and evaluation of emergency backup power; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clackamas River Water Board of Commissioners would authorize the acceptance of grant matching funds from FEMA for the evaluation and study of standby power requirements.

	Agenda Summary
Background	Clackamas River Water ("CRW") and the North Clackamas County Water Commission ("NCCWC") are parties to a Water Supply Agreement dated March 8, 2001 (the "Water Supply Agreement"), which is attached as Exhibit A. The Water Supply Agreement is set to expire by its terms on December 31, 2021. Staff for CRW and NCCWC have been negotiating a new long-term water supply agreement for consideration by the governing board of each entity but have not yet completed their negotiations.
	The next NCCWC board meeting will not be held until January 2022, after the expiration date of the current Water Supply Agreement. To avoid a lapse between the current agreement and the contemplated agreement, staff have recommended that CRW and NCCWC extend the current Water Supply Agreement on a month-to-month basis until June 30, 2022, or until the effective date of a new water supply agreement between CRW and NCCWC, whichever comes first. All other provisions of the Water Supply Agreement would remain in effect through the extended term. The proposed Extension of Water Supply Agreement is attached as Exhibit B.
	The proposed Extension was drafted by CRW legal counsel, Bob Steringer. The NCCWC Board has authorized approval of the extension.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION Staff recommends the Board authorize approval of an extension of the current NCCWC agreement until a new agreement is in place

Exhibit A

WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into this <u>CIP</u> day of <u>MARCH</u>, 2001 between the Clackamas River Water District (hereinafter "CRW"), which is an ORS Chapter 264 Domestic Water Supply District, and the North Clackamas County Water Commission, (hereinafter "the Commission"), which is an ORS 190 intergovernmental entity.

Recital:

Pursuant to ORS Chapter 190, CRW and the Commission are authorized to enter into intergovernmental agreements to perform functions and activities, which either unit of government is authorized to perform.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Supply of Water</u>. CRW agrees to provide the Commission 122 million cubic feet of water each calendar year during the life of this Agreement, and the Commission agrees to purchase this amount, unless modified by other provisions of this Agreement, for an initial twenty-year period beginning March 1, 2001, through December 31, 2021, subject to renewal, extension or termination on the terms and conditions as set forth in this Agreement. Every five years the parties will jointly review the quantity of water purchased and, if a change in purchase is anticipated, the parties will negotiate the terms of a change. The Commission will notify CRW six months before the end of each fifth year that it desires to change the amount of water purchased.

2. <u>Status of Prior Supply Agreements</u>. At the time of creation of the Commission, Water Supply Agreements existed between the Oak Lodge Water District (Oak Lodge) and CRW dated February 1, 1996, and between the Mt. Scott Water District (Mt. Scott) and CRW dated May 1, 1995. All water purchase responsibility for Oak Lodge and Mt. Scott has been assumed by the Commission. The Parties acknowledge that there are no outstanding claims or disputes of any kind remaining between them, including the Commission's predecessors in interests, Oak Lodge and Mt. Scott, concerning the aforedescribed Water Purchase Agreements and that this Water Supply Agreement supercedes and replaces all previous Water Supply Agreements between the parties.

3. <u>Connections and Meters</u>. The Commission will provide and maintain meters, valves and controls, including backflow prevention assemblies as necessary, as approved by CRW, in proper order for water transmission line connections at the following locations:

Mather Road Level:

Near the Mather reservoir at SE 92nd and Mather Road Near SE Mangan Way and Water Avenue

Otty Road: (Emergency Only)	Near SE 92 nd Avenue and Otty Road, near the reservoir owned by CRW On SE Mt. Scott Blvd. near SE 92 nd Avenue
152 nd :	At SE Pinegrove Loop near SE 152 nd Avenue and the CRW

reservoir site north of Highway 212

The Commission will arrange to have its meters tested and calibrated biennially by an independent tester qualified to do such work. A copy of the test report shall be forwarded to CRW. CRW shall maintain such valves and devices to control flows from its plant and reservoirs to the above listed connections.

4. <u>Flow Rates</u>. The ratio of peak daily flow to average annual flow measured in million gallons per day, will not exceed 1.2. The peak hourly flow rates at the delivery locations will be:

Mather Road Level:	4,500 gallons per minute
152 nd :	2,000 gallons per minute

5. <u>Rates</u>. The Commission shall be billed monthly for the water sold under this Agreement, and payment shall be made within 30 days of billing. A late fee of 1.5 percent per month shall be assessed for any unpaid balance.

The Commission will pay monthly to CRW for all water passing through connection points described in Section 2 above, at rates determined using cost of service principles described in Section 6 and adopted annually by Resolution of the CRW board. Effective on each successive January 1 during the term of this Agreement, or any renewal thereof, the rate shall be retained or modified in accordance with the criteria set forth in Section 6.

6. <u>Rate Setting Criteria</u>. In setting rates, CRW shall take into account the following, for the quantity of water proposed to be purchased:

A. Rates shall be determined in accordance with generally accepted ratemaking practices, as described in the AWWA M-1 Manual, 2000 Edition and subsequent amendments;

B. Rates shall include, but not be limited to, payments for reasonable operation and maintenance expense, depreciation, return on investment, administrative and general expenses, in-lieu taxes and other costs associated with CRW's financing and operation of its system. The rate of return on investment shall be 9%.

C. Rates shall be based on the approved budget for the future fiscal year and shall be effective on the first day of January for such fiscal year;

D. Costs and expenses shall be classified in the "base-extra capacity method" as described by the AWWA M-1 Manual, 2000 Edition and subsequent amendments;

E. For improvements to be installed during the fiscal year and for construction work in progress, the plant in service date shall be deemed the mid-year of the rate period; and,

F. The Commission will be given the opportunity to participate and provide input into CRW's rate-setting process.

G. In the event the Commission uses water at a rate in excess of the peak day ratio of 1.2 or peak hour rates in Section 4, except under emergency conditions, an excess use charge will be calculated and imposed for the additional amount, based on the location of delivery. If an excess use charge is imposed, the Commission will be entitled to use water up to the greater rate for the remainder of the year in which the charge was applied without incurring additional excess use charges.

7. <u>Billing</u>. Meters installed to measure the volume of water sold by CRW to the Commission shall be read periodically by representatives of CRW at times fixed by mutual agreement of CRW and the Commission. Representatives of the Commission may be present at meter readings. CRW shall compute and render bills and statements to the Commission by the 5th day of each month. If the meters at any time fail to accurately measure the water passage through said meters, the charge for water used during the time said meters are out of order shall be based upon the average daily consumption as shown by said meters when in proper operating condition during a comparable period of service. CRW shall invoice the Commission each month for water usage in the preceding month. The Commission will make payment on or before the 25th day of the month.

Inasmuch as the Commission has contracted to purchase a minimum amount of water each year and that is considered in the rate calculations, the Commission agrees to pay CRW the greater of: the amount calculated based on the actual volume of water passing through the meter(s) described above; or the amount calculated based on the minimum purchase amount. This calculation will be done annually after the end of the year.

8. <u>Exchange Water</u>. When water is delivered by the Commission to other locations on behalf of CRW, the volume of water delivered will be deducted from the volume delivered to the Commission in calculating charges for the amount purchased by the Commission. If the exchange amount is delivered entirely to the Commission at the Mather level, there will be no additional charges imposed for "delivering" water to the the Commission. If the additional water is delivered at either 152nd or Otty, a "wheeling" charge, equal to the added cost of serving those locations above the cost of serving the Mather level, will be due and payable. However, no party shall be required to exchange water if it would not be technically feasible, or if exchanging would create a hardship for the party being requested to do so.

9. Commission Service to CRW Customers.

A. The Commission agrees to provide, or cause its members to provide, water for domestic service to the high level area of CRW as may be best served by the Commission or its members and as authorized by CRW. The formula for computing the credit to the Commission for water provided to CRW customers will be determined by joint resolution of the CRW and the Commission Boards.

B. Water main extensions connected to the Commission system within CRW shall be installed and paid for by CRW, but materials and construction thereof shall be subject to approval by the Commission or its members.

C. Service connections to customers in the CRW high-level area served by the Commission or its members shall be made by CRW using materials and construction methods approved by the Commission. All such service connections shall pay applicable System Development Charges for this type and size of connection in the jurisdiction providing service.

D. Should pressure regulators be required either on CRW mains or CRW services, the installation and maintenance thereof shall be the responsibility of CRW and not the Commission or its members.

E. Meters on services from the Commission for customers residing in CRW shall be installed, maintained and read by CRW. The Commission may check services for leakage or any other purpose.

F. Similarly, CRW agrees to provide water for domestic service to areas of the Commission, or its members, as may be best served by CRW and as authorized by the Commission or its members. Charges for water provided to the Commission customers will be determined by the joint resolution described in 5.A above. Provisions of 5.B through 5.E above, with the names the Commission and CRW reversed, will apply where CRW serves the Commission or its members customers.

10. <u>Term</u>. This Agreement shall be for twenty-years, commencing with execution of this Agreement and ending twenty years thereafter.

The Commission agrees to notify CRW in writing as soon as practicable if the Commission wishes to extend the term of this Agreement, but not later than two years prior to the termination of this Agreement.

11. <u>Notices</u>. Notices shall be deemed sufficient if deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses:

North Clackamas County Water Commission Attn: General Manager 10602 S.E. 129th Avenue Portland, Oregon 97236

12. <u>Severability</u>. In the event any provisions of this Agreement shall be held to be impossible, invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding upon the parties hereto. One or more waivers by either party of any provision, term, condition or covenant, shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of subsequent breach of the same by the other party. Both parties have fully participated in negotiating and writing this Agreement; therefore, it shall not be construed against the party preparing it, but shall be construed as if both parties have prepared it.

13. <u>Acts of God, Emergency, Etc</u>. Performance or delay in performance of the obligations stated in this Agreement shall be reasonably excused when performance or timely performance is impossible or impracticable because of the occurrence of unforeseeable events such as emergency, catastrophe, disaster, labor disputes, or acts of God.

14. <u>Disputes: Attorney's Fees</u>. If a dispute arises between the parties regarding breach of this Agreement or interpretation of any term of this Agreement, the parties shall first attempt to resolve the dispute by negotiation, followed by mediation (if negotiation fails to resolve the dispute), and pursuant to the following steps:

Step One:

The general manager or other person designated by the governing bodies will negotiate on behalf of the entities they represent. The nature of the dispute shall be reduced to writing and shall be presented to each manager who shall then meet and attempt to resolve the issue. If the dispute is resolved at this step, there shall be a written determination of such resolution, signed by each party's manager and ratified by each governing body, which shall be binding upon the parties.

Step Two:

If the dispute cannot be resolved within ten days under Step One, the parties shall submit the matter to non-binding mediation. The parties shall attempt to agree on a mediator. If they cannot agree, the parties shall request the presiding judge of Clackamas County Circuit Court to appoint a mediator. The dispute shall then be heard by the mediator. The mediator's fees shall be shared equally by the parties. If the issue is resolved at this step, there shall be a written determination of such resolution, signed by each party's manager and ratified by each governing body, which shall be binding upon the parties.

Step Three:

Disputes that are not resolved after exhausting Steps One and Two shall be submitted to mutually agreeable arbitration or be resolved by proceedings in Clackamas County Circuit Court. If arbitration, suit or action is commenced, each party shall pay its own legal fees.

15. Full Agreement. This document is the entire, final and complete agreement of the parties pertaining to CRW's provision of surplus water to the Commission, and supersedes and replaces all prior or existing written and oral agreements between the parties or their representatives.

16. Service Reduction in Case of Emergency. If a general emergency or water shortage requires restrictions on the delivery of water, then general restrictions placed upon deliveries to the Commission shall be determined by a similar method to that used for restricting deliveries to Clackamas' own inhabitants and other direct service customers, employing a pro rata reduction.

EXHIBIT B

EXTENSION OF WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

This Extension of Water Supply Agreement ("Extension Agreement") is between Clackamas River Water District ("CRW") and the North Clackamas County Water Commission (the "Commission"), and is dated effective as of the date of the last signature below.

RECITALS

a. CRW is a domestic water supply district organized under ORS chapter 264, and the Commission is an intergovernmental entity organized under ORS chapter 190.

b. Pursuant to ORS chapter 190, CRW and the Commission are authorized to enter into intergovernmental agreements to perform functions and activities that either unit of government is authorized to perform.

c. CRW and the Commission are parties to a Water Supply Agreement dated March 8, 2001 (the "Water Supply Agreement").

d. The Water Supply Agreement is set to expire by its terms on December 31, 2021. CRW and the Commission wish to extend the term of the Water Supply Agreement according to the terms set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration for the covenants and promises herein, CRW and the Commission agree as follows.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>Term.</u> CRW and the Commission agree to extend the term of the Water Supply Agreement on a month-to-month basis until June 30, 2022, or until the effective date of a new water supply agreement between CRW and the Commission, whichever occurs first. Either party may terminate the Water Supply Agreement prior to June 30, 2022, with 30 days' written notice to the other party.
- 2. Except as provided in this Extension Agreement, all terms of the Water Supply Agreement remain in effect until it is terminated.
- 3. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Extension Agreement and the Water Supply Agreement constitute the entire agreement between the parties on the subject matter of the Water Supply Agreement. If any party has made statements or promises apart from the terms in those documents, the parties represent that they have not relied on those statements or promises, and understand that only the terms in this written Extension Agreement and the Water Supply Agreement are binding on the parties to this Agreement.

4. <u>Severability.</u> Should any part of this Extension Agreement be determined invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining parts shall not be affected thereby and they shall retain their full force and effect, and the invalid or unenforceable part shall be considered not to be a part of this Extension Agreement.

	Agenda Summary
Background	Sunrise Water Authority ("SWA") has two pending applications for the appropriation of surface water from the Clackamas River. One has been pending since 1974, and the other has been pending since 1986. SWA protested the Water Resource Department's ("WRD") proposed final orders on both applications and requested hearings. Recently, WRD initiated the process to adjudicate both applications in a contested case hearing before an administrative law judge.
	This motion relates only to the 1974 application, which is designated as S-74056. When SWA first decided in late 2008 or early 2009 to request a hearing on WRD's proposed final order on Application S-74056, CRW asked WRD to give CRW standing to participate in that hearing. CRW's written request for a hearing explained that CRW had two pending WRD applications to appropriate surface water, and WRD's decision in S-74056 could possibly harm CRW by affecting regional water supplies. CRW did not request standing to participate in Application S-86203.
	In 2015, CRW withdrew both of its WRD applications to appropriate surface water.

Now that CRW has withdrawn its WRD applications, it no longer has a material interest in participating in the hearing on SWA's Application S-74056. The outcome of SWA's application S-74056 will not affect CRW's existing water rights. Because the CRW Board of Commissioners previously approved CRW's decision to request standing, staff requests that the Board of Commissioners approve its withdrawal.

PROPOSED FINAL ORDER

Summary of Recommendation

The Department recommends that the application be denied because water is not available during the full season requested, and because the proposed use does not comply with Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapter 690 Division 33.

Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 537 and OAR 690-310 establish the process by which an application to use public waters may be submitted and evaluated by the Department.

In reviewing applications, the Department may consider any relevant sources of information, including the following:

- recommendations by other state agencies
- any applicable basin program
- any applicable comprehensive plan or zoning ordinance
- the amount of water available
- the rate and duty of the proposed use
- pending senior applications and existing water rights
- designations of any critical ground water areas
- Scenic Waterway requirements of ORS 390.835
- applicable statutes, administrative rules, and case law
- any general basin-wide standards for flow rate and duty of water allowed
- the need for a flow rate and duty higher than the applicable standard
- any comments received

Findings of Fact

1. On May 18, 1994, Mount Scott Water District submitted an application for a permit to use surface water:

Amount of Water: 10.0 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND (CFS)
Proposed Use: MUNICIPAL USE
Source: CLACKAMAS RIVER, TRIBUTARY TO WILLAMETTE RIVER
Location: CLACKAMAS COUNTY WITHIN SECTION 24, SECTION 25, SECTION 26, SECTION 27, SECTION 28, SECTION 33, SECTION 34, SECTION 35, AND SECTION 36, TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 EAST, W.M.; SECTION 1, SECTION 2, SECTION 3, SECTION 4, SECTION 10, SECTION 11, AND SECTION 12, TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 2 EAST, W.M.; SECTION 6, SECTION 19, AND SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 3 EAST, W.M.

2. On May 25, 1994, the Department gave public notice of the application in its weekly notice. The public notice included a request for comments, and information for interested persons about both obtaining future notices and a copy of the Proposed Final Order. No written comments were received within 30 days.

- 3. On September 20, 1995, the Department mailed the applicant notice of its Initial Review, determining that "The use of 10.0 CFS from Clackamas River for municipal use from November 1 through August 31 may be allowable." The applicant did not notify the Department to stop processing the application within 14 days of that date.
- 4. The application has been on administrative hold since the Initial Review was issued.
- 5. On November 7, 1995, the Department received comments from Kimberley Priestley, with WaterWatch of Oregon. Ms. Priestley had concerns regarding the proposed use:
 - a) water is not available;
 - b) does not comply with OAR 690-33
 - c) will deplete instream flows
 - d) water quality has not been addressed
 - e) measuring, recording, and reporting requirements
 - f) fish screening and fish passage
 - g) conservation
 - h) order of processing of application
- 6. On April 20, 1999, the application was assigned to North Clackamas County Water Commission.
- 7. On November 8, 2004, the application was assigned to Sunrise Water Authority, a water authority organized under ORS Chapter 450.
- 8. The Willamette Basin Program allows the use of water for municipal use.
- 9. Senior water rights exist on Clackamas River, a tributary of Willamette River, or on downstream waters.
- 10. Clackamas River, tributary of Willamette River is not within or above a State Scenic Waterway. The proposed point of diversion is located below the Clackamas River State Scenic Waterway.
- 11. An assessment of water availability has been completed. This assessment compared a calculation of natural stream flow minus the consumptive portion of all relevant rights of record. A copy of this assessment is in the file. This assessment determined that water is available for further appropriation (at an 80 percent exceedance probability) for the period November 1 through August 31. The assessment indicates that flows necessary for water rights senior to application S-74056 cause the Department to find that water is not available in the amounts requested during the period September 1 through October 31.
- 12. In accordance with OAR 690-33-330, an interagency team reviewed this proposed use for potential adverse impacts on sensitive, threatened and endangered fish populations. This team consisted of representatives from the Oregon Departments of Water Resources (WRD), Environmental Quality (DEQ), Fish and Wildlife (DFW), and Agriculture. WRD and DFW representatives included both technical and field staff. The interagency team recommended that additional limitations or conditions of use be imposed on this application as follows:

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a totalizing flow meter at each point of diversion. The permittee shall maintain the meter(s) in good working order. The permittee shall keep a complete record of the amount of water used each month, and shall submit a report which includes the recorded water use measurements to the Department annually or more frequently as

may be required by the Director. Further, the Director may require the permittee to report general water-use information, including the place and nature of use of water under the permit.

B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter(s); provided however, where any meter is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

DFW noted that the Clackamas River contains four species of salmonids including fall and spring stocks of Chinook Salmon (federally listed as threatened), Winter Steelhead (federally listed as threatened), Coho Salmon (state listed as endangered), and Cutthroat Trout. DFW is concerned with the potential impact to temperature and flows below the points of diversion. DFW cannot support the approval of this application until the applicant can demonstrate how instream flows will be met.

DEQ noted that the Clackamas River violates the temperature standard in the summer, and expressed concern regarding the cumulative effects of water withdrawal on water temperature; thus DEQ does not support the approval of this application.

13. The Department finds that:

- a) water is not available during the full season requested.
- b) based on a priority date of May 25, 1994, Division 33 applies to this application.
- c) any permit issued will be regulated based on the prior appropriation doctrine; thus, the senior instream water right will have priority over junior water rights.
- any permit issued will be conditioned so that the use may be restricted if the quality of downstream waters decreases to the point that those waters no longer meet existing state or federal water quality standards.
- e) any permit issued will require the installation of a totalizing flow meter, and require recording of the amount of water used each month and reporting of the amounts on an annual basis.
- f) any permit issued will require the installation, maintenance, and operation of fish screening and by-pass devices consistent with current Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's and National Marine Fisheries Service's standards.
- g) any permit issued will be conditioned to require beneficial use without waste.
- h) regardless of the order in which applications are processed, the prior appropriation doctrine protects senior water right holders based on priority date.

Conclusions of Law

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153, the Department must presume that a proposed use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest if the proposed use is allowed in the applicable basin program established pursuant to ORS 536.300 and 536.340 or given a preference under ORS 536.310(12), if water is available, if the proposed use will not injure other water rights and if the proposed use complies with rules of the Water Resources Commission.

- 1. The proposed use requested in this application is allowed in the Williamette Basin Program.
- 2. No preference for this use is granted under the provisions of ORS 536.310(12).
- 3. Water is not available for the proposed use during the full season requested.
- 4. The proposed use would not injure other water rights.

- 5. The proposed use does not comply with other rules of the Water Resources Commission, specifically OAR 690-033-0220(1).
- 6. The proposed use complies with requirements of the State Agency Coordination Program regarding land use.
- 7. For these reasons, the required presumption has not been established.
- 8. The Department therefore concludes that water is not available in the amount necessary for the proposed use; the proposed use would not result in injury to existing water rights; and the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest as provided in ORS 537.170.

Recommendation

The Department recommends that application S-74056 be denied.

Protests

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7), you can protest this Proposed Final Order. Protests must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than February 13, 2009, be in writing, and include the following:

- 1. Your name, address, and telephone number;
- 2. A description of your interest in the Proposed Final Order, and, if you claim to represent the public interest, a precise statement of the public interest represented;
- 3. A detailed description of how the action proposed in this Proposed Final Order would impair or be detrimental to your interest;
- 4. A detailed description of how the Proposed Final Order is in error or deficient, and how to correct the alleged error or deficiency;
- 5. Any citation of legal authority to support your protest, if known.
- 6. If you are not the applicant, the protest fee of \$350 required by ORS 536.050, and proof of service of the protest upon the applicant.
- 7. If you are the applicant, a statement of whether or not you are requesting a contested case hearing. If you do not request a hearing, the Department will presume that you do not wish to contest the findings of the Proposed Final Order.
- 8. If you do not protest this Proposed Final Order, and if no substantive changes are made in the Final Order, you will not have an opportunity for judicial review, protest or appeal of the Final Order when it is issued.

Requests for Standing

Under the provisions of ORS 537.153(7), persons other than the applicant who support a Proposed Final Order can request standing for purposes of participating in any contested case proceeding on the Proposed Final Order, or for judicial review of a Final Order.

Requests for standing must be received in the Water Resources Department no later than February 13, 2009, be in writing, and include the following:

- 1. The requester's name, mailing address and telephone number;
 - 2. If the requester is representing a group, association or other organization, the name, address and telephone number of the represented group;
 - 3. A statement that the requester supports the Proposed Final Order as issued;
 - 4. A detailed statement of how the requester would be harmed if the Proposed Final Order is modified.
 - 5. A standing fee of \$100.00. If a hearing is scheduled, an additional fee of \$250.00 must be submitted, along with a request for intervention.


After the protest period has ended, the Director will either issue a Final Order or schedule a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing will be scheduled only if a protest has been submitted and either:

This protest is filed on behalf of Sunrise Water Authority. Sunrise Water Authority is the applicant for S-74056. The address and phone number for Sunrise Water Authority is:

Sunrise Water Authority's interest in the Proposed Final Order to deny its application S-74056 is as follows. Sunrise Water Authority (SWA) is a water authority organized under ORS Chapter 450. As a water authority, SWA must ensure it has adequate and reliable supplies of water to meet its customer's needs and to ensure public health, safety and welfare. SWA's service area covers almost 14,000 acres and includes the cities of Happy Valley and Damascus and unincorporated areas in North Clackamas County. SWA currently serves a population of approximately 45,000 and must continually plan to meet its duty to provide water as land use changes and development occurs. To this end, SWA has invested significant resources into water resources planning, water supply infrastructure, maintaining its existing water rights, and securing water rights to meet future needs, including water supply needed for Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR).

The Proposed Final Order to deny application S-74056 will impair or be detrimental to SWA as follows. As a water authority, SWA must ensure an adequate supply of water for its customers. Given the limited capacity of SWA's groundwater permits and certificates, and the uncertainty of SWA's surface water rights (which are currently in a contested case proceeding regarding a protest to extension applications), SWA must continue to plan for the future. The proposed denial of application S-74056 directly impairs SWA to meet its water supply planning duties.

The Proposed Final Order is in error or deficient as follows:

• Water is available – despite the Department's Initial Review and Proposed Final Order indicating water is available in all months except September and October, the Department is proposing to deny the application because water is not available during the full season (year-round) requested. However, given SWA's need for source flexibility and the potential need for "off-season" water for ASR, SWA can demonstrate that beneficial use of water can be made during the months water is deemed "available" by the Department

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- Instream flows will be protected for fish This application will not impair instream flows protected by the relevant instream water right certificate on the Clackamas River. In its review of this application under OAR Chapter 690, Division 33, Oregon Department and Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) points out its concerns regarding listed fish species and water quality, and it concludes its review by remarking that ODFW cannot support approval of this application until the applicant can demonstrate how instream flows will be met. However, the Department's PFO makes it clear that application S-74056 is junior in priority to the instream water right and thus the senior instream water right will have priority. Finally, SWA is open to working with ODFW to develop permit conditions. The Proposed Final Order finding that the application does not comply with OAR Chapter 690, Division 33, with respect to listed fish species is in error.
- Instream flows will be protected for summer-time temperature This application will not impair summer water temperature standards. In review of this application under OAR 690, Division 33, Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) "expressed concern" regarding the cumulative effect of withdrawal under application S-74056. However, as described above, this application is junior to the relevant instream water right certificate on the Clackamas River and will be regulated off when legally protected flows are not met, (when flows reach 400 cfs in July and August). Moreover, any permit for S-74056 will likely not allow water use in September and October (the lowest flow months typically in the Clackamas River) due to water availability. The Proposed Final Order finding that the application does not comply with OAR Chapter 690, Division 33, with respect to water quality is in error.
- The Department incorrectly concludes the proposed use will be detrimental to the public interest In its conclusions of law the Department incorrectly reaches the ultimate conclusion that the use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest without evaluating the application further under ORS 537.170.

In summary, the PFO is in error by concluding: the application should be denied because water is not available year-round; the application should be denied because it does not comply with OAR Chapter 690, Division 33, and the application should be denied because the proposed use will impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

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WATER RESOURCES DEPT SALEM, OREGON SWA requests that the Department issue a final order to approve the application. In the alternative, SWA requests a contested case hearing to address this protest.

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

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

A. Management Report

1. Communications:

Monthly Report – The monthly report has been provided to the Board with the delivery of the packet materials and will be posted on the CRW website.

2. Intergovernmental Relations:

<u>Clackamas River Water Providers (CRWP)</u> – The CRWP met on October 6 to receive project updates and provide an opportunity for the CRWP members to provide feedback to staff on CRWP programs. Consultants provided status reports on the GIS Risk Assessment project and the National Water Quality Initiative Grant project.

<u>Regional Water Provider Consortium (RWPC) Board meeting</u> – The focus of the RWPC Board meeting was to "check in" on the RWPC Strategic Plan that was adopted in 2018. Time was provided for Board members to identify changes for consideration or obstacles to address. It is also time for the RWPC to begin work on the FY 2022-23 Budget and Work Plan, so the Board was provided an overview of the Work Plan concepts and recommendations from the RWPC Executive Committee. The Board expressed general support for a dues increase that is 5% or less. The RWPC Board also approved the addition of the City of Scappoose as a "Non-Regional" member of the RWPC.

Miscellaneous Intergovernmental Meetings -

 <u>Special Districts Association of Oregon (SDAO)</u> – The SDAO Board meeting was held on September 16. The focus of the meeting was to receive reports on SDAO activities and begin the discussion of proposed business plan goals for the next five years. In addition, the SDAO Conference Committee met to finalize the technical program schedule and confirm arrangements for the 2022 Annual Conference in February.

- <u>Oak Lodge Water Services (OLWS)</u> A quick "check in" call with the OLWS General Manager to get an update on the efforts to form an Authority.
- <u>North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District (NCPRD)</u> GM Heidgerken met (remotely) with the new NCPRD Director, Michael Bork. An overview of CRW was provided, including information about Riverside Park
- Oregon Water Utilities Council (OWUC) The OWUC . members met virtually to get a brief update on legislative activities and work group status from the SDAO Lobbyist, Mark Landauer. The Oregon Drinking Water Program Administrator noted efforts to update rules related with emergency response plans to make them consistent with federal requirements. The state is also working with very small systems on some additional water quality monitoring efforts related to per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The state is also waiting for the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) guidance on the implementation of the lead and copper rule revisions that are to go into effect on December 16, 2021. This guidance is needed for the State to approve rules implementing the program in Oregon. OWUC members then had a chance to share updates that included ongoing concerns related to supply chain disruptions for various water works parts. The OWUC meeting was held on September 23.
- <u>North Clackamas County Water Commission (NCCWC)</u> The NCCWC meeting was attended by both Commissioner Garrison and GM Heidgerken. Commissioner Garrison provided summary notes of the meeting which have been distributed to the CRW Board.
- <u>Oregon City (OC) Coordination Meeting</u> A meeting with OC public works and engineering staff was held to discuss a proposed development along Beavercreek Road and the availability of water service. OC has placed two measures on the November ballot requesting the ability to increase water rates and borrow money that could be used to build water infrastructure.
- 3. 90th Street Pump Station Electrical- Last year, necessary electrical service improvements were identified at this pump station, including replacing the main electrical service lines and transformer to the site. Coordination with PGE, combined with some site-specific constraints

on where to site the transformer, led to some expanded scope on this original maintenance/capital outlay project. The current approach will be to complete this work, utilizing CRW's electrical contractor and one of our on-call contractors, as a CIP project paid out of the CIP budget. Work is anticipated to cost under \$50,000 and is scheduled for completion within the next 2 months.


4. Emergency Management Report:

October 21st is our annual earthquake exercise, The Great Shakeout. Employees will practice life safety actions (Duck, Cover, Hold); building evacuation; identify non-structural mitigation needs in the workplace; and receive some education on earthquake risks in the Portland Metro Area.

The key focus areas for the 4th quarter of 2021 will be the rollout of our Emergency Response Plan to the workforce. Currently planning two workshops, one for management team and one for emergency preparedness committee in November and December, respectfully.

5. Security Update:


On October 6th, the first meeting of a Security Workgroup will occur. This meeting will convene staff with security responsibilities as well as vendors to understand the gaps and needs for CRW's security over the next 5 years. This workgroup is in direct response to our Risk and Resilience Assessment completed in 2020. We will be exploring our current state of technology and contractual relationships, define strategic priorities to guide resource prioritization for the replacement of end-of-life systems and expansion of security cameras and access control technologies to provide more coverage in high-risk areas.



6. Safety Update:

A focus on how to strengthen our chemical management efforts was initiated. The Safety Coordinator, the Chemical Hygiene Officer, and a consultant with WHA Insurance will be working on various projects for the next 14 months, over 4 phases, to improve our processes, training, policies, management tools, and partnerships in this area. Our strategic vision is to ensure that when it comes to chemical use, CRW is fulfilling its strategic goal to:

To be an employer of choice for attracting, developing, and retaining a highly qualified workforce by providing as safe, healthy, rewarding environment that values employee
