Regulatory

All 84 samples collected and analyzed for the January monitoring period showed no presence of coliform/E. coli bacteria.

Quarterly Disinfection By-Product sampling was conducted at 4 locations in the North Service Area and 4 locations in the South Service Area distribution systems.

Annual Point of Entry Sampling was conducted in the North and South Service Areas for inorganic compounds, including metals, synthetic inorganic chemicals (SIOCs, 29 regulated for drinking water, 5 unregulated), volatile organic compounds, (VOCs, 21 regulated, 36 unregulated) and synthetic organic chemicals (SOCs, 29 regulated, 14 unregulated).

Non-Regulatory

General water quality parameters (pH, temperature, chlorine, TDS, hardness, alkalinity) were collected throughout the distribution system at 19 locations in the North and South systems.

Monthly watershed sampling was conducted at 4 long-term sampling locations for total organic carbon, VOCs (Volatile Organic Chemicals), nutrients (nitrate/nitrite, total phosphorus, orthophosphate, etc.), coliform density, pH, dissolved oxygen, TDS, and temperature.

Quarterly watershed sampling was conducted at our intakes for inorganic compounds, including metals, synthetic inorganic chemicals (SIOCs, 29 regulated for drinking water, 5 unregulated), volatile organic compounds, (VOCs, 21 regulated, 36 unregulated) and synthetic organic chemicals (SOCs, 29 regulated, 14 unregulated).

Raw water at our intakes was tested for giardia and cryptosporidium.

Sampling for Other Agencies

50 routine samples were collected and analyzed during this period for Sunrise Water Authority for presence of coliform/E.coli bacteria.

(as of January 2021

As of February 1, the Willamette basin snowpack was 66% of normal. This is lower than last month when the Willamette basin snowpack was 85% of normal. An atmospheric river event January 12-13 brought significant rain on snow up to high elevations, causing some snowpack loss. The Clackamas Basin snowpack is 42% of Median (last year at this time was 73% of median).

- January **precipitation in the Willamette basin was 94% of average.** Precipitation since the beginning of the water year (October 1 February 1) has been 92% of average.
- The April through September streamflow forecast in the Clackamas River at Estacada is 86% of average. Overall, forecasts remain similar to last month's report. If conditions remain similar, water supplies in the basin are likely to be below normal to near normal this summer.
- On February 1st, over 90% of the state remains in a drought category, according to the National

Drought Monitor, with several counties in southern and central Oregon in the extreme drought category. The three-month outlook from the NOAA Climate Prediction Center predicts slightly elevated chances of above average precipitation and below average temperatures for much of northern Oregon, while southern portions of the state are predicted to have equal chances of above, normal, and below average precipitation and temperature.

• Though February 1st is early in the winter, the historic snowpack accumulation period is nearly halfway completed with peak snowpack generally occurring between mid-March and early April depending upon elevation and location across the state. The next two months will shape both future water supplies and drought conditions for 2021.
