BACKGROUND

In 2018 CRW conducted a RFQ (Request for Qualifications) process to identify Engineering firms to enter into contracts with for on-call Engineering services. At the time there were four firms that were selected and contracted with. Those on-call contracts expire October 31, 2024 with no remaining extensions.

In compliance with the Local Contract Review Board Rules (LCRB), staff conducted an intermediate procurement to identify firms to participate in on-call Engineering contracts with CRW. Five firms were contacted and provided a scope of the services under the contract. All five firms were interested in entering into contracts with CRW for on-call Engineering services.

With the increased engineering workload over the past several years, including private development review, CIP design and inspection, and other CRW engineering needs Staff continues to find value in contracting with experienced engineering firms proficient in general civil engineering services related to public water systems.

It was determined that due to available and future project workload, and with the departure of the Chief Engineer and subsequent transition; multiple firms would be selected to form an "on-call services" list that the District would be able to assign work for future needs. A short list of services that these consultants may perform for the District includes:

- General Civil Engineering services
- Planning and design of drinking water capital improvement projects, including but not limited to:
- Project Management Services
- Engineering Technical Assistance
- Emergency engineering services, including damage assessments and response, as required

A. Management Report

1. Communications:

Monthly Report – The monthly report will be provided to the Board separately and posted on the CRW Website.

2. Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting - CRW was recently informed that we have once again received the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. This Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting. Although we have been successful in receiving this award over a number of years, its achievement is still a significant accomplishment.

We are proud of our team's ability to obtain this Award and demonstrate our commitment to preparing financial reports that allow for information to effectively explain the financial health of our organization. A big "Thank You" goes to our Finance, Accounting and Customer Service (FACS) Department for their work in making the receipt of this award possible.

3. Clackamas River Water Providers (CRWP) – The CRWP Board met on October 2 to receive updates on several projects and to discuss the approach to comment on a petition submitted to the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) regarding amending the "Three Basin Rule". An overview of a US Geological Survey (USGS) Cyanotoxin study was provided with information regarding cyanotoxin analysis within various parts of the Clackamas Basin along with three other Cascade Range Rivers used for municipal drinking water supplies. The study looked at various types of cyanobacteria and used three different collection methods. The study is under peer review, but the initial results are helpful to gain a greater understanding of the presence and types of cyanotoxins that can be produced within the watershed.

The CRWP agreed to develop comments to be submitted to DEQ regarding Marion County's petition to amend the "Three Basin Rule". The "Three Basin Rule" was established almost 50 years ago to provide greater protection of the Clackamas, Santiam, and McKenzie River Basins. Included as part of these rules are limitations on discharges to these rivers. The recent fires in the Santiam Basin and the efforts to rebuild those communities, coupled with a recent US Supreme Court decision have created challenges that have resulted in Marion County seeking a change to the rules. Given the importance of the rule in protecting

water quality, the CRWP members felt it was important to provide comments indicating our role in one of the "Three Basin Rule" basins (Clackamas) and the importance of being included in any future rulemaking efforts.

The CRWP held its annual watershed tour. The focus of this year's tour was the four water treatment plants and the processes they used to provide our communities with safe drinking water. Participants had an opportunity to start the day at the CRW Water Treatment Plant and were provided a tour by CRW's Water Quality Technician, Alan Schacht. A big "Thank You" to Alan for providing the overview of the treatment process but also to Steve Houck, CRW Water Resources Manager, for his coordination with the CRWP staff.

- 4. **Regional Water Providers Consortium (RWPC) Board Meeting** The RWPC Board met on October 9th to discuss the FY 2025-2026 RWPC Budget and Work Plan and consider adoption of the updated RWPC and Executive Committee bylaws. Actions from the RWPC Board meeting will be provided during the CRW Board meeting on the 17th. In addition to the routine program reports, the RWPC members received an update from some of the water providers regarding innovative efforts to use alternative energy options and addressing energy needs.
- 5. Special Districts Association of Oregon (SDAO) Metro Breakfast SDAO organized its quarterly gathering of special districts in the Metro Area. The group heard about transportation issues from Rick Metzger, a former legislator, who was Chair of the Senate Transportation Committee. The informative and entertaining presentation outlined the transportation funding needs and challenges in anticipation of the 2025 Oregon Legislative Session.
- 6. Clackamas County's Clean Water Future The Oregon City Business Alliance dedicated their October Forum to educating its members on water. More specifically how best to build resilience, manage challenges and demands, and support public and environmental health, all while ensuring economic prosperity for the long haul. The event was sponsored by Clackamas Water Environment Service (WES) and included panelists from Sunrise Water Authority, Clackamas River Water Providers, Consultant Brown and Caldwell, and Clackamas River Water.
- 7. **Down the River Clean Up -** Earlier in September, CRW staff, Brandi Litteral and Kham Keobounnam volunteered to help with the annual Down the River Clean Up. Dozens of volunteers cleaned up the riverbanks between Carver Park and Clackamette Park. Brandi and Kham focused their volunteer efforts at our own Riverside Park. This event has been held annually since 2003 and over 42 tons of garbage has been removed, with half of that being recycled. Thank you to Brandi and Kham for taking the time to make Riverside Park cleaner.
- 8. **Service Line Inventory Update-** The service line inventory required by the revisions to the federal Lead and Copper Rule was submitted to the Oregon Health Authority in advance of the October 16th deadline. A general statement of our findings has been posted to the CRW website. Note that, as previously reported to the Board, no lead service lines were identified in CRW's water system. Special thanks to those in the System Operations department who helped with this multi-year effort!
- 9. **Emergency Update** Every 5 years, CRW participates in a planning process regarding natural Hazards (earthquake, flood, fire, etc.) with a number of jurisdictions in Clackamas County. And part of understanding our natural hazards, we also select projects that CRW

- could complete (with funding or budget allocations) to reduce the impact of these hazards on our operations and risk of failure/breakage.
- 10. **Safety** As part of CRW's safety training program there are trainings, some on-line and some in person, to be completed by the end of October. Some of the trainings are department specific and others are for the full staff to complete.
- 11. Security Update The security system upgrade is now fully complete and "punch list" items have been addressed. A thank you to staff for their patience and support as this massive change is moving to a maintenance mode. Also, CRW had another successful summer at the Riverside Park with the contracted on-site resource officer. The officer was on site at the park for 8-hour shifts five days a week which included weekends and holidays. The presence of the officer reduces the need for staff response to issues and creates a point of contact for park patrons.

Agenda Summary

BACKGROUND

Under Section 3.1 of the Employment Agreement between CRW and Todd Heidgerken, the General Manager's base salary is adjusted annually for a cost-of-living increase. The agreement establishes a minimum cost-of-living adjustment of 2% of the gross annual salary. The Board also has the discretion, under Section 3.1 of the agreement, to provide a greater cost-of-living increase beyond the 2% minimum. If approved, the proposed additional 2% increase would be applied to the payroll cycle that concludes on October 25, 2024, and is paid on November 1, 2024.

3.1 <u>Base Salary</u>. The General Manager's current salary is \$165,630.75 per year. Effective July 1, 2021, CRW shall pay General Manager a gross annual salary of \$173,913.00 per annum, minus applicable local, state and federal tax withholdings and other withholdings that General Manager has authorized, payable at least monthly in accordance with CRW's payroll practices in effect from time to time. Effective on July 1, 2022, and annually every July 1 during the term of this Agreement, the General Manager will receive a "cost of living" increase of two percent (2%) of his gross annual salary, or such greater amount as the Board of Commissioners may in its discretion establish. The parties mutually agree to review the General Manager's salary stated herein not less than once every other year in comparison to reasonably comparable water districts in the Portland metropolitan area. The parties shall then determine whether an adjustment to the General Manager's salary is appropriate.

Regulatory

All 73 samples collected and analyzed for the September monitoring period showed no presence of coliform/*E. coli* bacteria.

Cyanotoxin Testing

Microcystin and Cylindrospermopsin sampling of our raw water began in May and occurs every two weeks through October for compliance, and the samples are analyzed at our in-house accredited laboratory.

No cyanotoxins have been detected in our raw water.

Non-Regulatory

General water quality parameters (pH, temperature, chlorine, TDS, hardness, alkalinity) were collected throughout the distribution system at 16 locations in the North and South systems.

Monthly watershed sampling was conducted at 4 long-term sampling locations for total organic carbon, nutrients (nitrate/nitrite, total phosphorus, orthophosphate, etc.), coliform density, pH, dissolved oxygen, TDS, and temperature.

Weekly algae monitoring is occurring at 3 locations in the North Fork Reservoir and CRW's intakes. This work includes species monitoring with the FlowCAM and nutrient analysis.

- The current Clackamas River 7-day average streamflow is 78% of normal (median).
- **September precipitation in the Clackamas basin was 74% of normal.** Precipitation since the beginning of the water year (October 1 September 30) has been 101% of normal.
- The three-month outlook (Oct-Dec) from the NOAA Climate Prediction Center calls for equal chances of above and below temperatures and a slightly elevated chance of above normal precipitation for Western Oregon.
