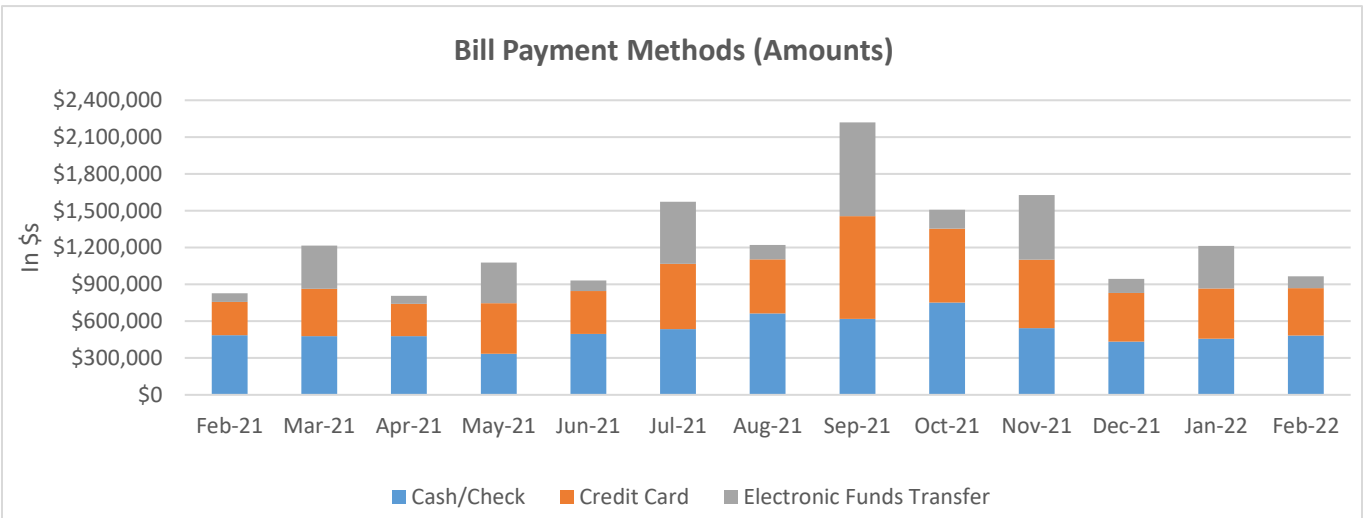
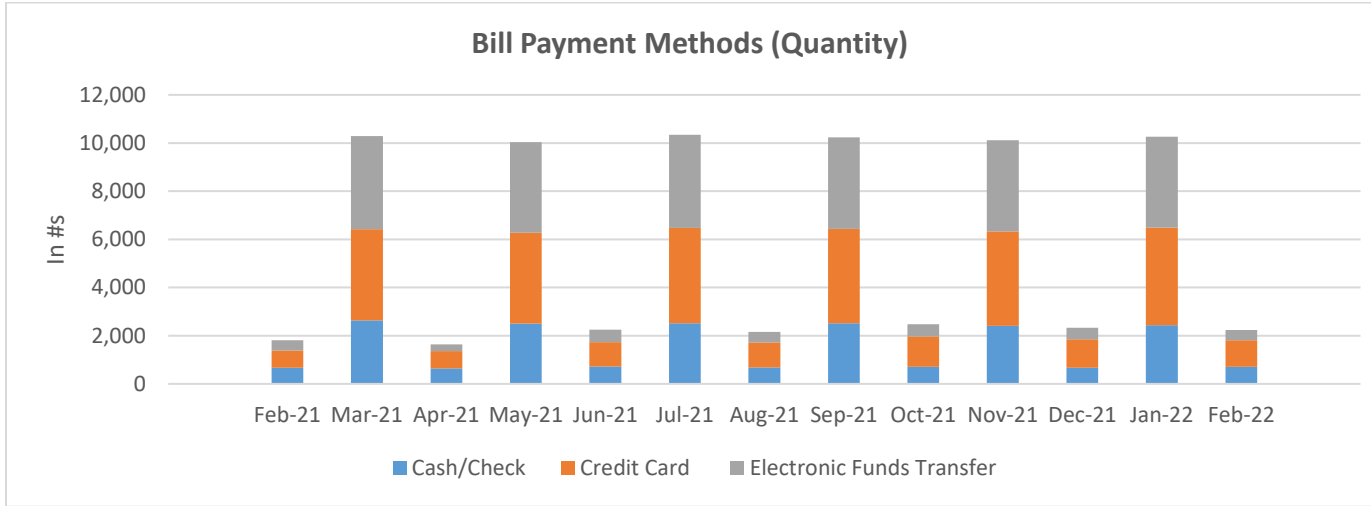
## Financial Activity



- 1) Water revenue is up due to heat waves in June & Aug. causing greater water use for the summer billing cycles. 2) SDC Revenue is higher primarily due to receiving more than normal applications prior to the increased rates effective July 10, and other SDC payments at the new rate approved by the Board in June 2021. 3) There are no costs for CIP Bond as that fund was closed out in FY 2021 but will be reported in the 5-year graph until 2026. 4) Personnel Services expenses were high in FY 2020 due to the payment of the PERS transitional liability.

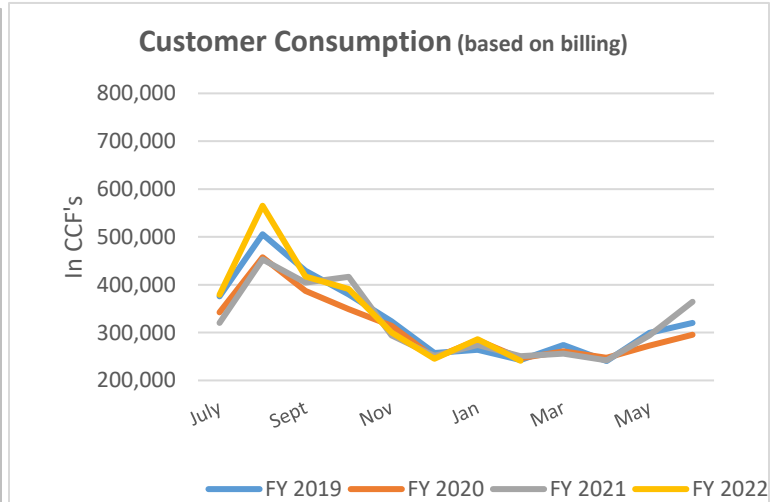
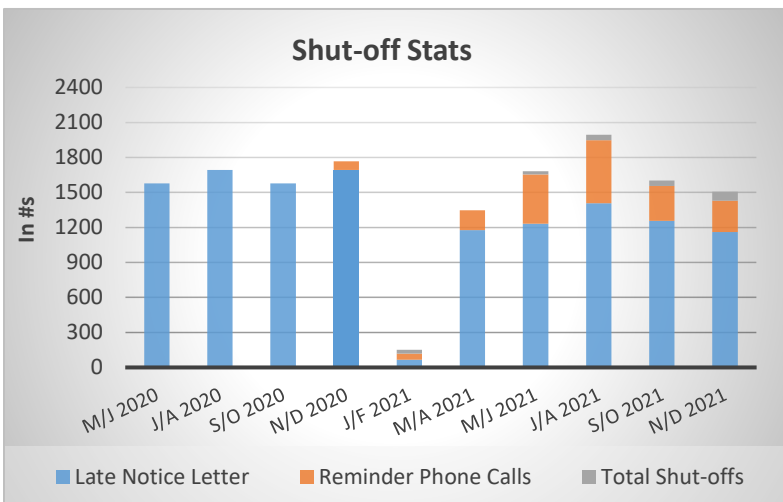

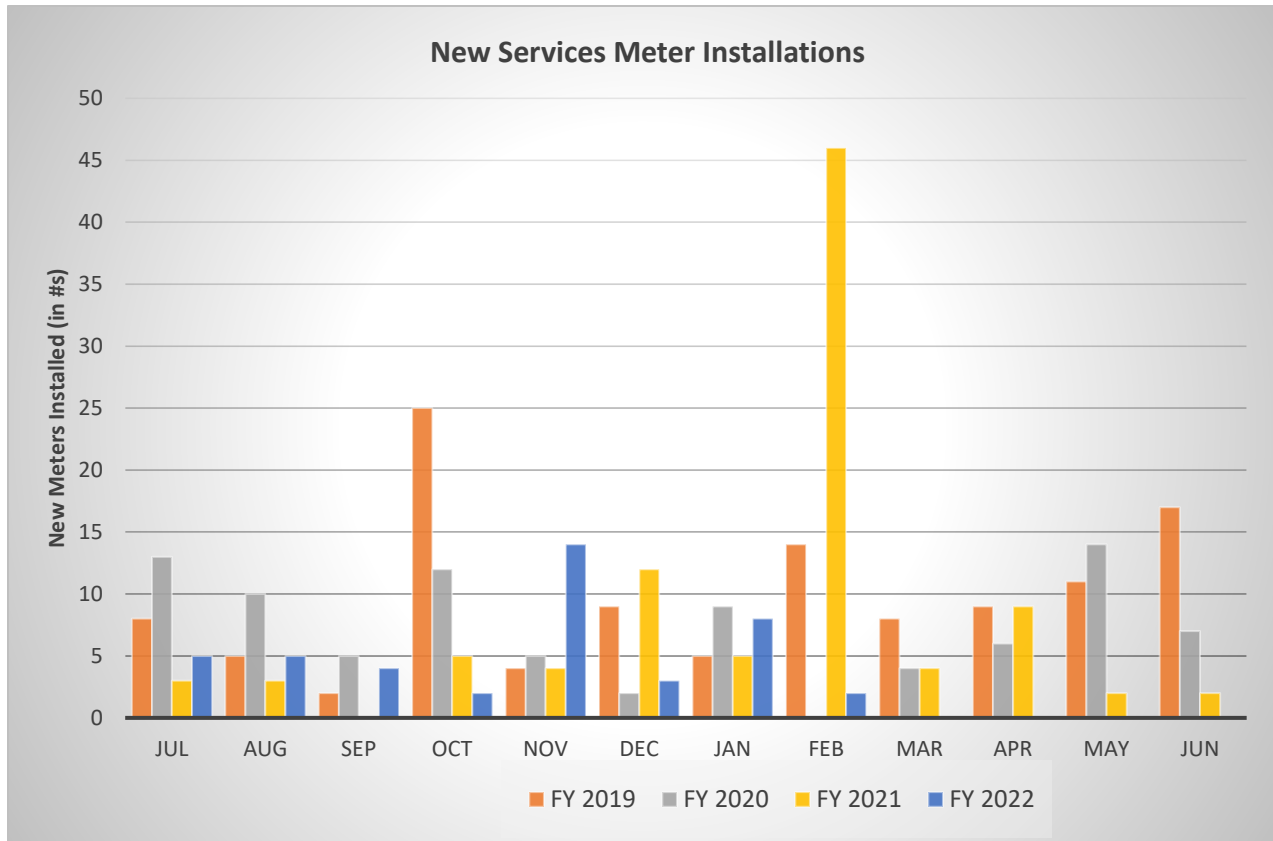

Credit Card – Received via CRW Initiated Automatic Payment, Walk-ins/Phone Calls, and Website

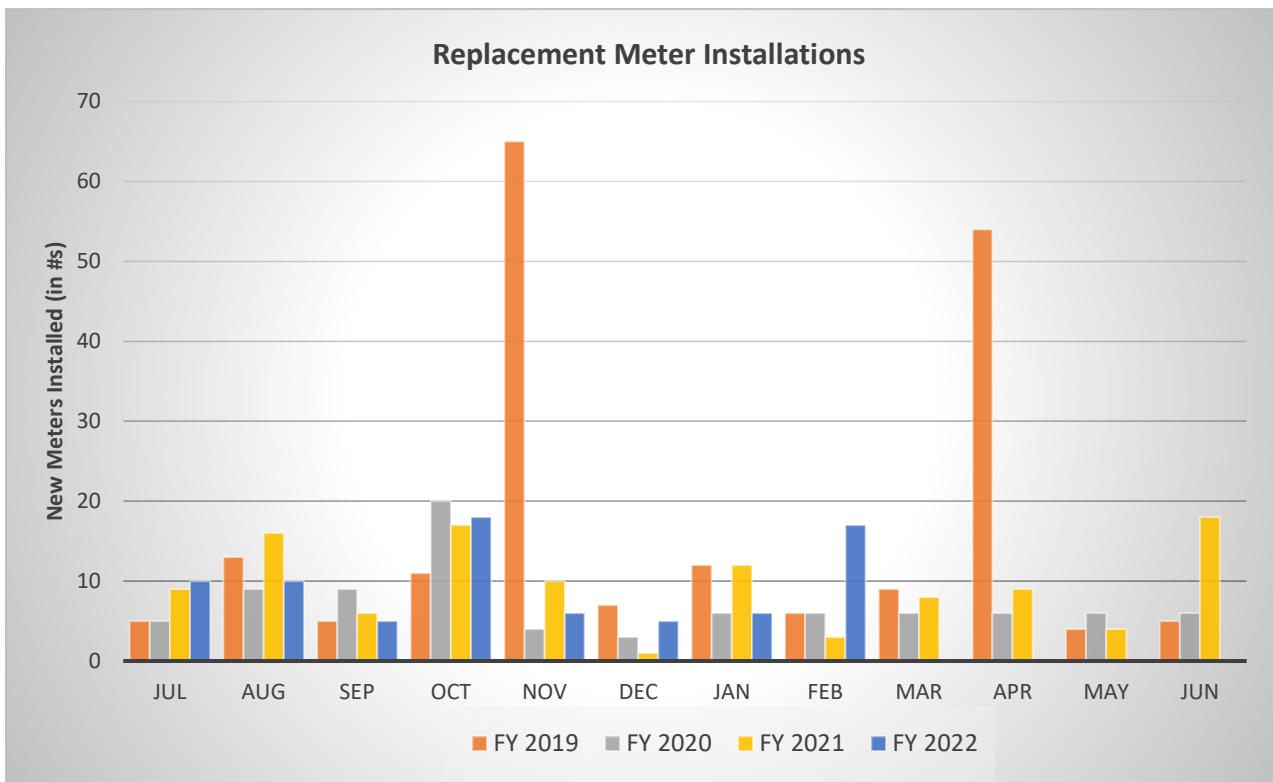
Electronic Funds Transfer – Received via Bank to Bank Transfer, Automatic Checking Withdrawal (RapidPay)

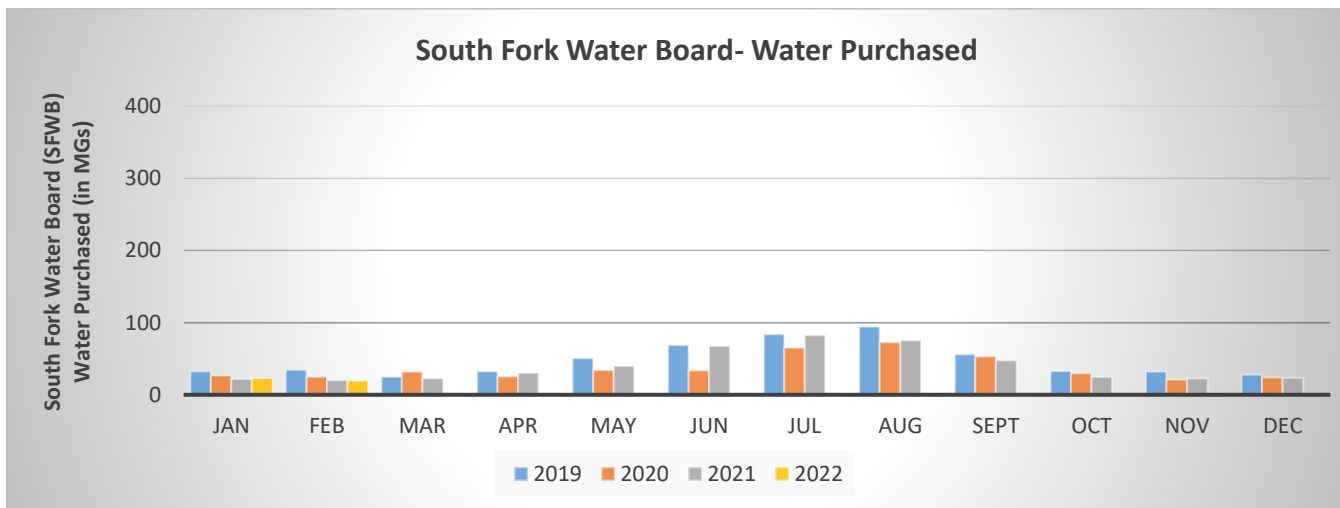
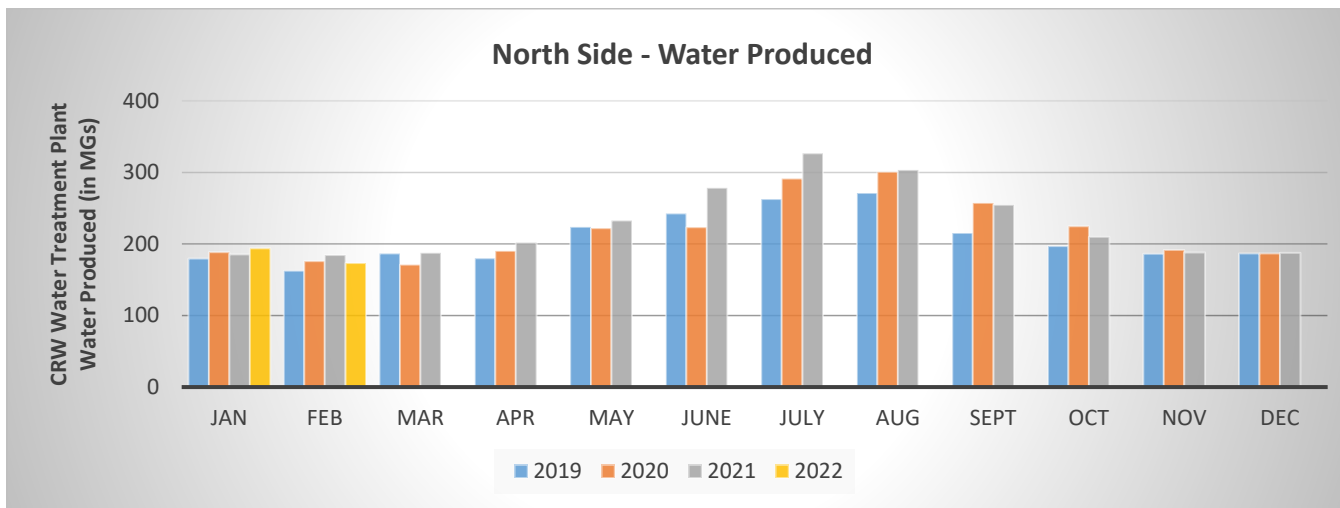
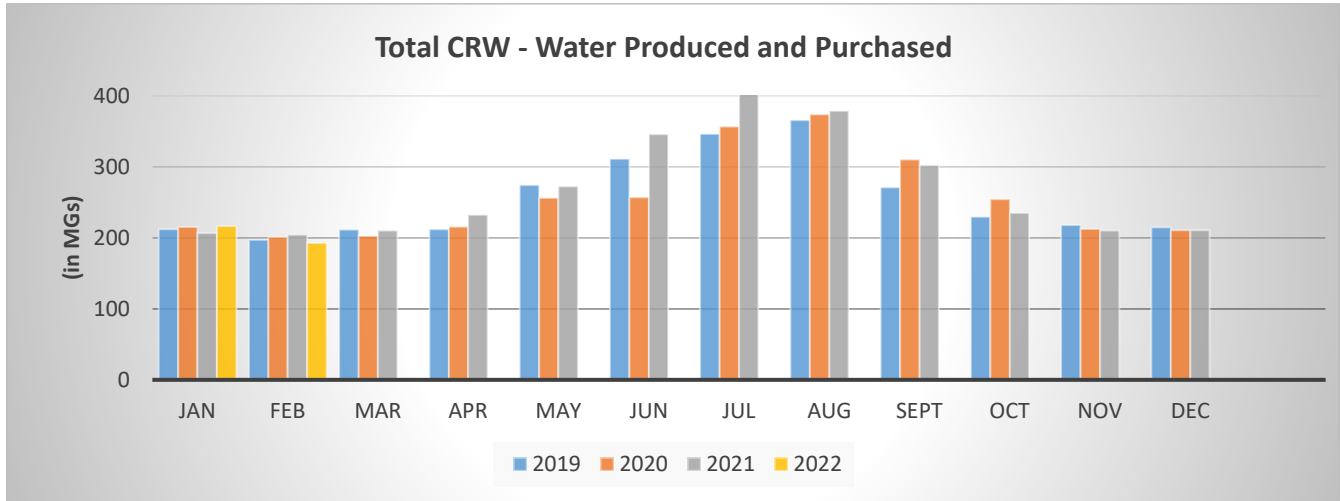

### **Regulatory**

All 73 samples collected and analyzed for the February monitoring period showed no presence of coliform/E. coli bacteria.

### **Non-Regulatory**

General water quality parameters (pH, temperature, chlorine, TDS, hardness, alkalinity) were collected throughout the distribution system at 19 locations in the North and South systems.

Monthly watershed sampling was conducted at 4 long-term sampling locations for total organic carbon, VOCs (Volatile Organic Chemicals), nutrients (nitrate/nitrite, total phosphorus, orthophosphate, etc), coliform density, pH, dissolved oxygen, TDS, and temperature.

Raw water at our intakes and finished water was tested for giardia and cryptosporidium.

- As of March 1st, **the Willamette basin snowpack was 100% of median.** This is lower than last month when the Willamette basin snowpack was 124% of median.
- **Basin precipitation in February was 58% of median,** and since the beginning of the water year (October 1 - February 1) has been 94% of median.
- The April through September **streamflow forecasts in the Clackamas River at Estacada is 113% of median.**
- The three-month outlook from the NOAA Climate Prediction Center calls for slightly elevated chances of above normal temperatures and precipitation for much of northern and western Oregon.
